TAPPING YOUR NATURAL GENIUS FOR JOB SEARCH

Some 37 million people found new jobs in the US in 2008 according to the Department of Labor (1 in 4 workers). The probability that you will land a job depends less on your resume or on the hiring organization but more on how awake you are.

Our head gets overwhelmed from conflicting inputs, whereas the heart can withstand information overload and still provide the right intuitive path, provided we are awake. Listen more to your heart. We'll describe what that means.

Successful job search requires investment of time in at least eight areas (shown on the right). Don't behave like a hunter relying purely on a shot gun approach for temporary success; rather be a farmer, sowing the seeds for long term payoff.

Referring to the figure on the right, the Resume, Compass and Job Search Documents work will bring clarity to your message and open up new possibilities. Proper Goal and Time Management can improve your efficiency and effectiveness by up to 10X. When you "Connect" people enroll to your cause. Showing up in the sandbox of WEB 2.0 signals that you can mix work, learning, teaching and play. Manifesting your destiny: Set aside 3-4 hours each day to reinvent yourself, bridge critical skills gaps, and above all remain positive and inspiring.

We'll share real-life lessons for successful job search based on the achievements of our workshop students. Our workshop graduates got not one, but often multiple job offers within weeks. All of us have the capacity to produce similar, extraordinary results, if we choose to believe in ourselves and let our latent genius guide us.
